## LOUISIANA FIREFIGHTERS TO GATHER TO HONOR FALLEN FIREFIGHTERS

State Fire Marshal H. "Butch" Browning and Department of Agriculture and Forestry Commissioner Mike Strain, in partnership with the Walk of Honor Foundation, announced today that the 2014 Louisiana Fallen Firefighter Memorial will be held on Saturday, March 29. The ceremony will begin at 11:00 a.m. and last 90 minutes. The Memorial is located at 8181 Independence Blvd. in Baton Rouge. The event will be attended by representatives from various fire departments, fire service organizations and families of those firefighters who have died in the line of duty. The event will be emceed by Scott Rogers of the Around Town TV Show. A luncheon will be held immediately following the ceremony. The event and luncheon are free and open to the public.

This year's Louisiana Fallen Firefighters' Memorial ceremony will spotlight Wildland Firefighters by unveiling a new monument in their honor. This monument was designed and created by the Department of Agriculture and Forestry. 104 Louisiana municipal and wildland firefighters have paid the ultimate price in the past and are honored on the Wall of Honor.

"We owe a great deal to those who selflessly put themselves in harm's way every day to protect us. This ceremony is an opportunity for the public to come and join the families and friends of those who paid the highest price and to let them know that they will never be forgotten." Browning said. "This beautiful memorial is a place of reverence; a place where you can walk among the names of giants."

Fire Marshal Browning also stated that Baton Rouge based 1stCo Productions, producers of the Around Town TV Shows have agreed again to provide camera production services to record the ceremony.
