CEASE AND DESIST ORDER-UPDATE

Hurricane Ida, a category 4 storm, made landfall August 29, 2021 and caused major rainfall, storm-surge flooding, high winds, and power outages throughout the state of Louisiana. It also caused severe damage to several water systems in many Louisiana communities. As a result, these communities are without adequate water service for potential fire suppression needs.

Therefore, to assist in preventing potential fire-related dangers during this state of emergency and to assist local first responders by reducing unnecessary fire calls that will be a challenge to answer due to a lack of infrastructure, resources, and personnel due to the effects of and response to Hurricane Ida, the State Fire Marshal hereby orders a continued cease and desist order for all private burning, pursuant to his authority under R.S. 40:1602 for the parishes of Iberville, Jefferson, Lafourche, Orleans, St. Bernard, St. Charles, St. John the Baptist, and Terrebonne. Private burning shall only be allowed by permission of the local fire department or local government.

The previous order is now lifted for Ascension, Assumption, Livingston, Plaquemines, St. Helena, St. James, St. Tammany, and Tangipahoa parishes.

This order shall not apply to prescribed burns by the Department of Agriculture and Forestry, by those trained and certified by the Department of Agriculture and Forestry, by those who conduct prescribed burning as a "generally accepted agriculture practice" as defined by the Louisiana Right to Farm Law, or as permitted by the Louisiana Department of Environmental Quality.

This order is effective September 17, 2021 at 8:00 a.m., and shall remain in effect until rescinded.
