If the appliance is returned to service, then at the next inspection we would inform Health Care of the change and they would then rescind the letter of variance. My only concern is the amount of time that would pass between their starting to use the appliance and the actual protection of the appliance being installed. It seems to me that this method above leaves a lot of liability for everyone concerned. I believe the best policy would be, if it is under the hood used or not, it must be protected.
